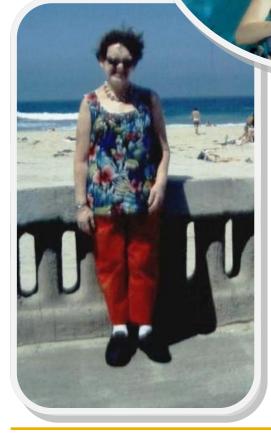

Election Year Profile: Rep. Kyrsten Sinema, Legislative District 15



One of the candidates for political office this year is well known to The Tungland Corporation as a staunch ally of our community during last year's budget battles: Kyrsten Sinema, assistant minority leader of the Arizona House of Representatives and a member of the House Appropriations Committee who fought against the budget cuts, was the featured speaker at all of our commu-

nity rallies in 2009 and 2010 protesting the cuts that affected thousands of Arizonans who depend on social and health services.

Representing the 15th Legislative District in Phoenix for three terms in the Arizona House, Representative Sinema is running for the Arizona Senate. In the debates on the 2010 and 2011 budgets Rep. Sinema was a leader of those legislators opposed to the cuts to the Department of Economic Security and the communities most affected. She is also well known as an advocate for civil rights and the plight of refugees.

Beginning her career as a social worker, Rep. Sinema is an adjunct professor at the Arizona State University School of Social Work and a practicing attorney. In 2009 she published her first book, "Unite and Conquer: How to Build Coalitions that Win and Last" and was appointed to the White House Conference on Health Care Reform by President Barack Obama.

Quick Entrees! Healthy Meals In a Hurry

- Make whole wheat English muffin pizzas using pizza sauce and reduced-fat mozzarella cheese. Top with your favorite vegetables such as mushrooms, chopped onion and green pepper, tomatoes, broccoli or artichoke hearts.
- Top mixed salad greens with chopped cooked chicken, sliced fresh strawberries, and slivered almonds; serve with Wish-Bone Salad Spritzers in Balsamic Breeze Vinaigrette.
- Make quick and easy chili with extra-lean ground beef or ground turkey, canned kidney beans, tomato sauce, chopped onion, canned chopped tomatoes, a chili seasoning packet, and canned corn.
